Geoff owns and operates a one hundred and twenty acre family farm, in Halton Hills which the family has owned for a century. He has a wide spectrum of knowledge in all aspects of farming: cattle, sheep and chickens; cash cropping of corn and wheat; and racehorses. He has bred and raced some of Canada's top Standardbred horses, receiving three O'Brien Awards for trotting horses he has trained.

Geoff has sat or sits on several boards and committees, including:

- The National Farm Animal Care Council from 2009 to 2014 to update the Equine Code of Practice (the sole racehorse representative);
- Ontario Harness Horse Association (2008 -2017) District 6 (Guelph/Cambridge) area through to Etobicoke Woodbine;
- Chairman of the Ontario Harness Horse Association's R.R.S.P. program currently with assets of over sixteen million dollars and growing;
- The Board of the Halton Region Federation of Agriculture; and
- Rural Policy and Zoning Review Committee for Halton Hills.

Geoff recently graduated a course from the University of Guelph to receive his certificate for Agricultural Operation Planning Certificate for Nutrient Management.

Geoff is married to Shanna and they have four children together (Cody, Logan, Sierra, and Lily) and a son from a previous relationship (Will). They have energetically worked with Credit Valley Conservation since 2011, receiving a "Friends of the Credit Conservation Award of Distinction," in 2014 for their commitment to practice sustainable agriculture.

Geoff's family and his father George, operate "Cody's Cows," a business which supplies meat to local farmer' markets. His continued appreciation for fine horses means that there are always a couple Standardbred broodmares in his barn.
