Robert Goodings

Citizen-at-Large

Robert Goodings, P. Eng., has a history of leadership in engineering in the planning, design, construction operation and financing of municipal water supply and wastewater systems. He has worked in virtually all the communities in the CTC Region, as well as in many parts of Canada and abroad.

Mr. Goodings served for approximately 45 years as a professional engineer, an officer, and then as the chair of Gore & Storrie Limited in Toronto (now part of CH2M Hill Ltd Canada). After retirement, Mr. Goodings continued to play a role on the firm's engineering teams, including international projects. He has assisted the Canadian Executive Services Organization (CESO) in an assignment in Bolivia as a specialist in water and sewage rates for the City of La Paz.

After retirement in 1994, Mr. Goodings served as a lieutenant governor-in-council appointee on the Professional Engineers Ontario Council (PEO) and was elected president in 2005. While president of the Ontario Society of Professional engineers (OSPE) in 2001, he chaired the Safe Water Task Force, which participated in Part II of the Walkerton Inquiry appearing before Commissioner O'Connor and later before the provincial parliamentary committee concerning the *Safe Drinking Water Act*.

Mr. Goodings has continued to serve the water and wastewater industry through his work on the Ontario Water Works Association's reports *Water Rates Practices and Operations Benchmarking in Ontario*.

In his career, he has received recognition through several significant awards and honours from the American Water Works Association (AWWA) and the Water Environment Federation (WEF), Professional Engineers Ontario (PEO) and the Engineering Institute of Canada (EIC).
